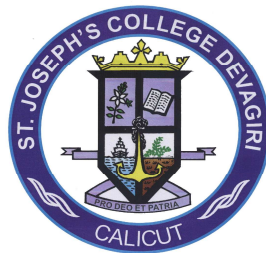

# **The Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) of the IQAC**

**Name of the College: St. Joseph's College, Devagiri, Calicut**

**Year of Report: 2004-'05**

**Part A:** The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) was constituted in the College for ensuring quality sustenance and enhancement, during the post-accreditation period, as a continuous process under the guidelines of National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). A meeting was held on 29<sup>th</sup> March 2004 in the College and in that meeting the general body of the IQAC was constituted.

The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year aimed the overall development of the college. Ample thrust was given to both infrastructure and academic developments of the Under Graduate (UG) and Post Graduate (PG) teaching departments as well as the Research departments.

**The main proposals in the action plan are:**

- To encourage teaching and non-teaching staff to participate in refresher courses, seminars, workshops, etc.
- To encourage and help the teachers apply for minor and major research projects.
- To organise orientation programmes for staff members with experts.
- To further strengthen research activities.
- To undertake more collaborative works.
- To arrange more seminars and invited talks.
- To begin lecture series in various disciplines.
- To strengthen the audio-visual facilities
- To modernise library facilities.
- To acquire more books and journals for the library
- To computerise office administration.
- To extend internet facility to staff and students.
- To offer more personal counselling to students.
- To strengthen career guidance and placement activities.
- To widen association and co-curricular activities.
- To enhance poor students' fund.
- To conduct remedial class for weak students at UG level.
- To conduct coaching classes for competitive examinations
- To start a film club with state level registration.
- To strengthen alumni activities further.
- To give more attention to academic activities in order to improve the result and number of rank holders in University examinations
- To build up an eco friendly campus.

**The outcomes achieved by the end of the year:**

During the year 2004-'05, the College organized two national level seminars and 29 self funded invited talks/seminars were organized by different departments of the College. This year, the faculty have initiated seven new minor research projects and three major research projects of different funding agencies. The faculty members and research

scholars have published more than 15 research papers in reputed national/international journals. They have also attended more than 75 national/international conferences, seminars and workshops. Our Principal Rev. Fr. V.T. Joseph has received the *Rashtriya Gourav Award* of India International Friendship Society, New Delhi instituted to honour those who have rendered meritorious services in educational, social, cultural and commercial fields. During this period, the institution secured two University ranks in UG and six in PG with a high pass percentage. The Departments of Botany and Zoology have received FIST assistance during this period. The research Departments of Zoology and Botany have produced three PhDs during this year. The institution has taken steps to upgrade the Departments of Chemistry and English to the status of Research Centres and the proposals for the same were sent to university for recognition. The Institution has conducted remedial classes for weak and SC/ST students and coaching classes for UGC NET/JRF for arts subjects. Our students actively involved in various community activities under the leadership of National Service Scheme (NSS), Compulsory Social Service (CSS) and the Social Work Department of the College. They were actively involved in blood donation, community services, cleaning the campus, helping the weak students of the nearby school by taking classes, etc. This year, our students bagged first prize in both B-Zone and Inter-Zone arts competitions conducted by the University of Calicut. There were a number of toppers in the field of sports. A number of seminars and placement opportunities were conducted by the career guidance and placement cell of the College. The automation work of the office is progressing. The Library has acquired more books and journals and the distribution of books has been completely computerised.

## **3. Innovations in curriculum design and transactions**

Affiliated colleges have little scope in the preparation of their own syllabi. The syllabi and curriculum are reviewed and revised every three years by the Board of Studies concerned at the University level and many members of the teaching faculty regularly contribute to the revision and redesigning of the curriculum by being members of various official as well as voluntary academic bodies like the Board of Studies, Kerala Mathematical Association, Botany Teachers Association, Organization of Physics Teachers In Calicut University – *OPTIC* etc. and by participating in special workshops organized by the University and other academic establishments. The University often seeks and makes use of the expertise available in this institution for framing the syllabus.

Besides this, the institution is continuously monitoring students through activities like internal examinations, group discussions, seminars etc.

#### 4. Inter- disciplinary programmes started

The new programmes that were introduced (mentioned in item 2) were all of an inter-disciplinary nature.

#### 5. Examination reforms implemented:

This institution has already appointed a committee for internal examinations which monitors the whole process of examinations. The evaluation methods were announced in the orientation classes by the tutors of respective classes at the beginning of the academic year. The time table for the conduct of examinations was given in the academic calendar. Class tests were conducted regularly for all the programmes. In addition, two terminal examinations for second and third year degree students and one terminal examination and a model examination for first year degree students were conducted on the University question pattern. The results were exhibited in the department notice boards and intimated to the parents within two weeks of the examinations and the tutors concerned gave timely advice and proper guidance to those students who did not perform well. For PG students two or three tests were conducted for each paper per semester apart from seminars and assignments.

The P.T.A. and the committee for internal examinations supervised the conduct of the examinations and ensured that progress reports were sent to the parents in time.

#### 18. Community Services

**25. Computerization of administration and the process of admissions and examination results, issue of certificates**

The process of automation of the college administration is progressing. A programme working in Linux platform has been installed, and as a first phase of automation, first year admissions were all computerized. Salary bills and issue of some certificates were already automated.

**26. Increase in infrastructural facilities**

To keep pace with academic growth like establishment of research centres in various disciplines, the introduction of new courses and increase in the number of quality students, the College has augmented its resources and upgraded its available facilities.

The College canteen was renovated with separate sections for the staff, boys and girls.

This year the institution has purchased 10 Computers, LCD, P A system, DVD Player etc. The Library was fully automated this year.

**27. Technology up gradation**

Quality is the cumulative product of both human and material resources in any educational institution. This institution regularly makes technology up gradation along with its academic growth. Computerization of the library with internet facility and software development towards office automation on Linux platform were some ventures in this regard. Departments like Botany, Zoology and Chemistry are doing research and are well equipped. The administrative machinery has improved a lot in its service due to computerization and systematic monitoring.

**28. Computer and internet access and training to teachers and students**

Internet facility is provided for all students and staff at a nominal rate in the library.

Internet facility is also available in Departments like Mathematics, Botany and Zoology.

**29. Financial aid to students**

There are many students who are socially backward and economically poor and the institution strongly believes that no student should be denied access to higher education because of financial difficulties.

The College has established about thirty one scholarships and endowments for the benefit of outstanding students. About one-third of the students enjoy fee concession under KPCRA and Harijan Welfare Schemes. In addition, this institution extends assistance to a few more students for which it raises a Students Welfare Fund. The Employees' Co-operative Society also helps a few poor students. Some students avail financial aid in the form scholarships from the Central and State Governments.

### **30. Activities and support from the alumni association**

The College Alumni Association was formed to establish partnership between the alumni and the management to help the institution in the on going developmental efforts.

The alumni association brings the former students to maintain close contact to encourage liaison among the alumni who belong to different rungs of career and are scattered in the country and abroad. 21 teachers are former students of this College and many former students hold prominent positions in society. This has organized the All Kerala Iner-Collegiate Basket Ball competition Tournament for Men and Women from 24 to 28 January 2005.
