ST. CHAVARA KURIAKOSE ELIAS

(1805-1871)

Founder, CMI Congregation



Saint Chavara was a social reformer, an educationist, a social entrepreneur and a prolific poet. He deserves a place in the pantheon of socio-religious reformers. Millions, irrespective of caste and creed, benefited from his work, which triggered a social, cultural and intellectual awakening in Kerala.

Saint Chavara was a pioneer of educational reforms. When education was the privilege of the social elites, his *Pallikkoodam Movement* enabled universal access to education. He ordered that schools be set up on all church premises and threatened to close down those that failed to comply. He took special initiative for the education of the Dalits. In 1846, Saint Chavara established in Kerala a Sanskrit school that enabled ordinary people to study. He was a true Karma Yogi who worked tirelessly to liberate people from the tyrannies of ignorance, poverty and sickness.

The first indigenous Catholic religious congregation for men, the Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (CMI), founded in 1831 by Saint Chavara, ensures the service of dedicated and highly skilled personnel at the academic and administrative levels in the educational institutions ranging from playschools to professional colleges spread across the country. St. Joseph's College, Devagiri is an institution managed by the CMI congregation which continues to pursue the vision of universal and affordable education upholding the teachings of Saint Chavara.

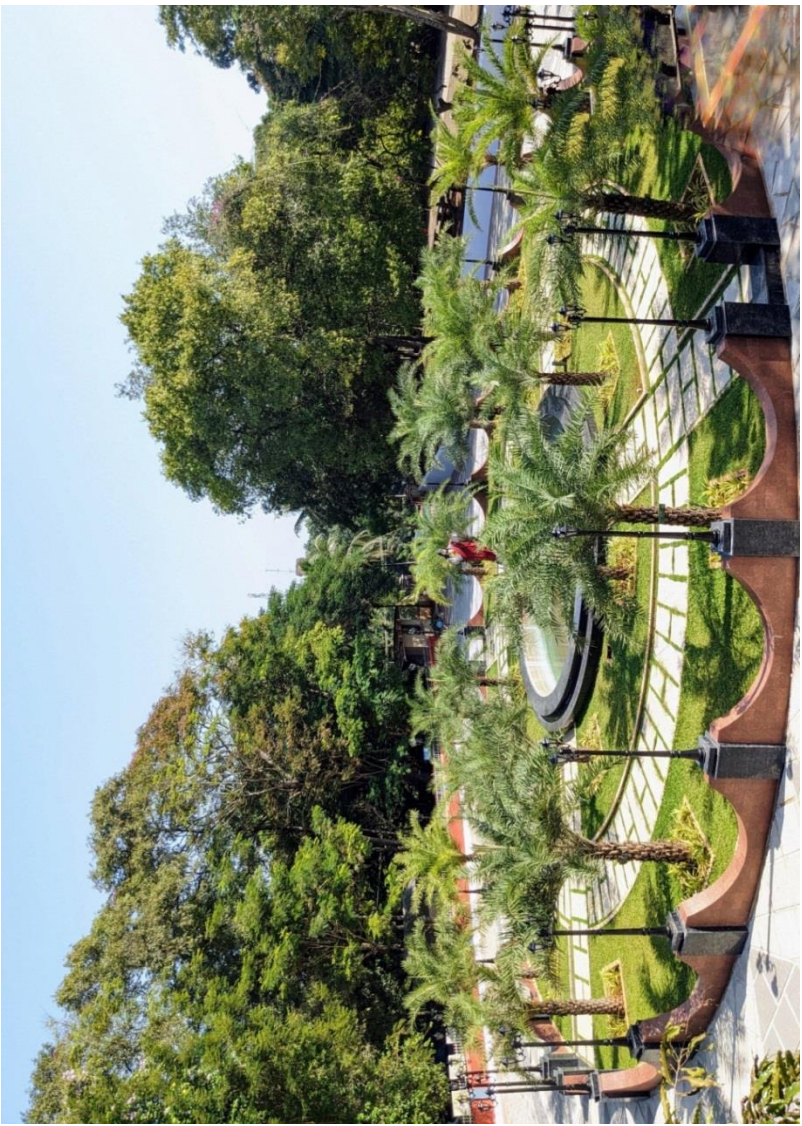

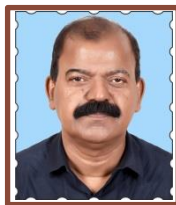

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A PANORAMIC VIEW



INTRODUCTION

Envisioned by the CMI Congregation and established in 1956, St. Joseph's College, Devagiri, is a Christian minority institution affiliated to the University of Calicut. The college was recognised as a "College with Potential for Excellence" by the University Grants Commission in 2010 and 2014. In 2016, Devagiri won the coveted title, "the first college in the country to get A++ grade", under the latest grading pattern of NAAC by scoring 3.76 out of 4 in the third cycle of accreditation. Devagiri secured 59th position in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) in 2023. With 7 Research Centres, 13 Post-Graduate Programmes, 25 Under-Graduate Programmes and more than 50 certificate/value-added courses, this institution maintains its reputation for diversification. Within the span of sixty seven years, this institution grew as one of the prestigious colleges in India. It has at present more than 3600 students studying in various disciplines. It has a staff strength of more than 170 teaching and 100 non-teaching staff.

LOCATION AND THE CAMPUS

The college is situated on a small hill of scenic beauty known as 'Devagiri', which means the 'Hill of God.' The campus is located about six kilometres away from the heart of Calicut city and is opposite to Calicut Medical College. The campus spreads across sixty acres of land covered with shady trees. Other than the college, there are five other Devagiri institutions on the campus: three aided schools (Savio L.P. School, Savio High School and Savio Higher Secondary School), one unaided school (Devagiri Public School), and one for the differently abled (Asha Kiran). There are also hostels for boys and girls, staff quarters, a chapel, an open-air theatre, a playground with eight-lane running tracks and fields for games.

THE COLLEGE EMBLEM



The Emblem of this college is a pictorial representation of its holistic vision which corresponds with the educational policy of the Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (CMI), the first indigenous religious congregation to whose pioneering efforts and sustained support this institution owes its genesis and progress. The crown at the apex is an archetypal symbol of authority and victory, suggesting this institution's commitment to 'empowerment through education' and of its optimism about the ultimate victory over all forces of darkness. The lily on the top

left panel, a symbol of purity, stands for the Patron of this College, St. Joseph. Christian tradition has it that the dry twig in St. Joseph's hand flowered forth, and hence the flowery twig carries the additional suggestion of the founding fathers' dream of an intellectual, spiritual and cultural efflorescence in Malabar, and by extension, everywhere around. On the spiritual level, the open book on the top right panel stands for God and the Sacred Scripture, the Alpha and Omega of wisdom, the be-all and end-all of life, and articulates the message that the fear of God is the beginning of wisdom. On the temporal level, the bookstands for knowledge, the dissemination of which is the short-term objective of this institution. The sea and the ship on the bottom left panel have multiple layers of meaning: the blue sea suggests the deep and boundless expanse of knowledge and the ship implies the deliberate and tenacious effort to explore it and reach a desirable destination. The anchor, which has its ring on the spiritual upper half of the Emblem; its flukes overlapping onto the sea and the land on the temporal lower half, highlights the need to hold on to hope and faith in order to unify temporal and spiritual dimensions to overcome the turbulence of the sea. The virgin soil and the sturdy tree symbolise God's bounty and support to man. The tree supports the vine that hopefully depends on it and enables it to grow up and bear fruit as God protects and blesses the faithful. Also, the ship and the vine suggest the agricultural and industrial sectors of the economy for the balanced growth to which this institution intends to contribute. The motto, 'Pro Deo Et Patria' (For God and country), inscribed at the bottom of the emblem, is a concise Latin rendering of this institution's commitment to the Creator and the fatherland.

AUTONOMY

St. Joseph's College, Devagiri was granted Autonomy by the University Grants Commission on June 22, 2014. Based on the National Policy on Education (1986-92), autonomous college will have the freedom to:

- Determine and prescribe its own courses of study and syllabi, and restructure and redesign the courses to suit local needs;
- Prescribe rules for admission in consonance with the reservation policy of the State Government;
- Evolve methods of assessment of students' performance, the conduct of examinations and notification of results;
- Use modern tools of educational technology to achieve higher standards and greater creativity;
- Promote healthy practices such as community service, extension activities, projects for the benefit of the society at large, neighbourhood programmes etc.

University Grants Commission (Conferment of Autonomous Status upon Colleges and Measures for Maintenance of Standards in Autonomous Colleges) Regulations, 2018 defines the role/ terms and conditions of an autonomous college as:

- Review existing courses/programmes and, restructure, redesign and prescribe its own courses/programmes of study and syllabi;
- Formulate new courses/programmes within the nomenclature specified by UGC as per the Specification of Degrees 2014 and amended from time to time;
- Evolve methods of assessment of students performance, conduct of examinations and notification of results;
- Announce results, issue mark sheets, migration and other certificates.

However, the degree shall be awarded by the University with the name of the college on the degree certificate.

DISCIPLINARY RULES

Students should strictly follow the disciplinary rules of the College. One is not expected to plead that one is not aware of the existence of such rules. Ignorance of rules is no excuse. Students are expected to read the notice board on a day-to-day basis. It is the duty of every student to abide by the rules and regulations of the college and conduct himself/ herself with decency and decorum. Violation of the rules will result in disciplinary action against the offenders and imposition of punishment including dismissal.

I. ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

- Students should be regular and punctual in attending classes.
- Attendance will be marked at the beginning of each hour by the teacher engaging the class.
- If one teaching hour is missed it is equal to missing half a day's attendance.
- The students who have attendance within the limit prescribed, but could not register for the examination have to apply for *token registration*, within two weeks of the commencement of the next semester.
- A student shall be normally permitted to register for the examination if he/she has required minimum attendance. If the student has a shortage of attendance below 65% in a semester, the student shall be permitted to move to the next semester (if the attendance is more than 50% - Provisional registration) and can write the examination for the entire courses of the semester in which shortage of attendance occurs, as supplementary examination only after the completion of the entire programme. In such cases, a request from the student may be forwarded through the Principal of the college to the Controller of Examinations within two weeks of the commencement of the semester. If the attendance is less than 50%, the student is

ineligible to continue the programme and has to seek readmission.

- There will not be any Repeat Semester as per CBCSSUG2019 regulations.
- Components with percentage of marks of Internal Evaluation of Theory Courses are- Test paper 40%, Assignment 20%, Seminar 20% and Class room participation based on attendance 20%.
- A student abstaining from classes without proper acknowledgment of leave for more than fourteen consecutive working days will have his/her name removed from the rolls.
- Application for condonation of shortage of attendance will be considered only if the absence is on medical ground and necessary Medical Certificate is attached. *(For details regarding condonation refer to the section on Examination Rules in the handbook)*
- Claim of attendance for Extracurricular activities: Students who could not attend classes on account of their participation in NCC/NSS activities, sports and games, University arts festivals, seminars, workshops and such other approved extracurricular activities with the prior permission of the teacher in charge within or outside the campus may claim attendance subject to a maximum of 9 days in a semester. Students who have availed of such leave shall submit their application for attendance in the students portal. Considering the merit of the activity, the teacher in charge of the programme and subsequently the Vice Principal in charge of attendance will approve or disapprove the application. Once it is approved by the authorities, the attendance for extracurricular activities will be reflected in the attendance report.
- No student is expected to approach the Principal or the Principal's office in person for enquiry on attendance. In case of any doubts or grievances, they may approach the tutor concerned. Students can verify their attendance status from the college website using their login ID and password.

II. CHARACTER AND CONDUCT

1. Conduct Certificate will not be issued as a matter of course. It has to be earned by the student's good conduct and behaviour. The decision of the Principal shall be final regarding this matter.

2. The teaching hours of the College are from 9.00 am to 3.00 pm from Monday to Thursday and from 9.30 am to 3.30 pm on Fridays. The Campus will be open to all the students from 8.00 am to 5.00 pm. Those students who wish to participate in extracurricular activities are permitted to remain on campus till 6.00 pm provided a written request submitted by the students through proper channel (recommended by faculty-in-charge) is sanctioned by the Principal.
3. Students shall greet both teaching and non-teaching staff on the occasion of their first meeting them during the day.
4. When the Principal or teacher enters a classroom, students shall stand greet and keep standing till they are asked to sit down.
5. Every morning we begin our work with the recital of the National Anthem followed by a prayer. When the bell goes for National Anthem and prayer, all the members of the staff and students are expected to keep standing in silence till the prayer ends.
6. Students should be seated in their respective class rooms before the teaching hour commences.
7. Students should be seated in their respective class rooms by 8.50 a.m. on all days except Fridays and on Friday by 9.20 am. They should not leave the classes except during intervals.
8. When a student wants to enter or leave the classroom while the class is on, he/she shall do so only after getting the permission of the teacher.
9. During the absence of the teacher and while moving from one class to another, students are expected to keep silence.
10. Students shall not loiter on the verandahs or college premises during working hours for any reasons whatsoever.
11. Students are advised to use the library during free periods.
12. Students shall not enter any class other than their own.
13. No indecent representation shall be made by any student towards any other student either in words, letters, gestures or by any other means.

III. CONDUCT IN THE EXAMINATION HALL

1. Books, bag, electronic gadgets (mobile phones/ programmable calculators/ smart watches etc.) etc. are not allowed in the examination hall.
2. There will not be any provision in the examination hall for the students to keep their belongings.
3. Entry to the examination hall requires identity card and hall ticket issued by the college.

4. All students should occupy their seat in the examination at least 10 minutes before the commencement of the examination.
5. Students are bound to follow the instructions given by the invigilator.
6. No writing or marking other than the name and register number of the candidate is allowed on the question paper.
7. To seek assistance from the invigilator including getting an additional answer sheet, the candidate should stand up.
8. Exchange of any article between students appearing for the examination is totally banned in the examination hall.
9. Strict silence should be observed in the examination hall.
10. Disobeying the invigilator, attempts of copying from other students' answer paper, exchange of papers or other articles between candidates, talking to other students inside or outside the examination hall, giving signs/hints to others leading to guessing of answers, writing answers in cloth/body/seat etc., undisciplined behaviour in the hall, bringing banned articles to the hall etc, are treated as examination malpractices which warrant strict disciplinary action.
11. The following procedure will be adopted strictly in the case of any malpractice during examinations.
 - I. The answer sheet and hall ticket of a student resorting to any malpractice will be confiscated by the invigilator and handed over to the Chief Superintendent along with a report. A duplicate answer book may be issued.
 - II. At the end of the examination the student will be asked to give a written explanation.
 - III. The confiscated answer book and other materials used will be handed over to the Principal on the same day for further action.
 - IV. Normally the Principal will entrust the matter to the standing committee of three teachers constituted by the Governing Council of the college to deal with exam malpractice. The committee after hearing the student and considering the report of the invigilator and the gravity of the case will decide the appropriate action to be taken (including cancellation of one or more or all the examinations of the semester or debarring from subsequent semester exams).
 - V. As per University Order a fine of Rs. 2500/- for the first attempt and Rs. 5000/- for the second will also be levied.
 - VI. If the student refuses to admit the offence and does not give a written explanation, the committee will make detailed enquiry and arrive at an appropriate decision.

- VII. The action taken will be announced and subsequently published on the college notice board.

IV. DRESS CODE

There is no prescribed uniform for the students. Students should wear decent dress, i.e. churidar with shawl/dupatta for girl students and pants/dhoti and shirt for boys, in keeping with the decorum of an educational institution. Showy clothes, T-Shirts without collar and with offensive colour prints are to be avoided. Boys shall not tuck up their dhoti while they are on campus. Dresses or facial make up or masks covering the identity of a person in any form are not allowed on campus except during specific fine arts programmes.

V. EXAMINATION RULES

(FOR UG STUDENTS)

Attendance: Minimum 75% attendance is required to appear for the end semester examination. Benefits of attendance may be granted to students who attend the approved curricular/extracurricular activities of the college/university with the prior concurrence of the Head of the institution (maximum 9 days in a semester). To get this benefit students have to apply through the teacher-in-charge of the activity.

Condonation of shortage of attendance: Condonation of shortage of attendance to a maximum of 10% in the case of single condonation and 20% in the case of double condonation in a semester can be granted by the Principal. For this, students have to apply in the prescribed format and remit the required fee. Students can avail of condonation of shortage of attendance in a maximum of four semesters during the entire programme (Either four single condonations or one double condonation and two single condonations). If the attendance is 50% or above but below the condonable limit, the student cannot appear for the examination but can move to the next semester. In that case, a provisional registration is needed. Such students can appear for supplementary examination for that semester after the completion of the programme. Less than 50% attendance requires readmission. Readmission is permitted only once during the entire programme.

Evaluation: Each course is evaluated by 10 point indirect grading system (For BCom Professional & BBA Honours 7 Point indirect grading system). Indirect grading means, grade is given based on the range of mark

obtained. Evaluation has two parts 1) Internal Assessment (20%) and 2) External Assessment (80%).

Internal Assessment: Internal Assessment is done by the course teachers based on predetermined transparent criteria involving test papers, assignments, seminars, attendance etc.

External Assessment: External Assessment is based on end semester examinations conducted by the college. There will be end semester examination at the end of each semester. Notification of this examination will be published one month before the examination in the college website and on the college notice board. Notification contains details of fee remittance, dates for registration, downloading the hall ticket, commencement of examination etc.

Students can register for the examination through the student portal in the college website with the user ID and Password given. Required fee is to be paid online.

Hall Ticket can be downloaded from the date given in the notification up to the date of commencement of the examination. Students have to make sure that the name in the hall ticket is correct. If there is any change they should contact the office of the Controller of Examinations.

Time table will be published at least two weeks before the commencement of examination.

Students should occupy their seats in the examination hall at least 10 minutes before the start of the examination. Students should bring their hall ticket and ID card. Malpractice of any kind is strictly forbidden.

Answerscripts are valued in the valuation camps by teachers. Chief examiners from other colleges will revalue a certain percentage of the answer sheets and scrutinize all the answer sheets.

Practical examinations are scheduled by the Departments concerned and conducted by external examiners.

Results will be published within a few weeks after the completion of the examinations. Students can view the results through the student portal using their user ID and Password.

Revaluation/Scrutiny/Photocopy: Students can apply for Revaluation/Scrutiny/Photocopy within 10 days from the date of publication of the results. Required fee is to be remitted (All exam related fees are non-refundable).

Pass conditions for courses: In the case of common, core, complementary and open courses, for a pass, minimum P grade (35% marks) is required when external and internal marks are put together. A minimum of 20% marks for external is also needed for a pass. There is no separate minimum for internal. Students need attain only pass (Grade P) for audit courses.

Extra Credits: Extra credits are mandatory for the programme. 4 extra credits will be awarded to students who participate in activities like NCC, NSS and Swachh Bharat. Those students who could not join in any of the above activities have to undergo 12 days social service programme.

Total Credits to be acquired:

A student need to acquire a minimum of 140 credits for the completion of the UG programme of which 120 credits are for common, core, complementary & open courses, and shall only be counted for SGPA and CGPA. Audit courses have 4 credits per course and a total of 16 credits. 4 credits are to be acquired from extra credit activities ($120+16+4 = 140$).

NB: For BCom Professional, BBA Honours, BSc Honours in Mathematics and BCom Honours 7-Point indirect grading system is followed. In the case of these two programmes E grade (50% marks) is required for a pass in a course.

Total credits to be acquired in BCom Professional & BSc Honours in Mathematics programme is 120.

Total credits to be acquired in BBA Honours & BCom Honours programme is 140. Total credits for common, core and elective courses is 120 and 20 credits for ability enhancement courses (4 credits each for 5 Courses).

Semester Grade Card: The college shall issue to the students grade card on the completion of each semester. If the student passes in all the courses, SGPA will be given in the grade card.

Improvement: Improvement of a semester can be done only once in the succeeding year after the successful completion of a semester. The students can improve a maximum of two courses in a semester.

For the improvement of a semester after the successful completion of the programme (improvement of 5th and 6th semesters) students have to surrender TC, Final Grade Card and Provisional Certificate. Further they have to submit a declaration that they have not applied for the original degree certificate.

Improvement and supplementary examinations cannot be done simultaneously.

Supplementary: The number of supplementary chances is not limited but the student should complete the programme within 6 years from the date of registration

Grace Marks: Grace marks may be awarded to students for achievements in cocurricular activities such as sports, arts, NSS, NCC and Student entrepreneurship. In addition a maximum of 6 marks per semester can be awarded to students of UG programmes for participating in the College Fitness Education Programme (COFE). Students with some specified disabilities are also eligible for grace marks. Grace marks can be added to a maximum of 8 courses in an academic year spreading over two semesters. To add grace marks, students have to apply to the Controller of Examinations through the teacher-in-charge. After adding grace marks, the total marks for a course should not exceed 84%.

Final Grade Card: The Final grade card issued by the college after the completion of the programme shall contain the details of all the courses taken during the entire programme and the grades obtained. Final grade card also includes the cumulative grade point average (CGPA) and the percentage. The CGPA and percentage marks of Common Courses, Core courses, Complementary courses and Open course shall be given separately. The list of audit courses passed and the details of extra credits acquired will also be given in the final grade card.

Programme Completion Certificate/Transcript/Backlog Certificate/

Position Certificate: College shall issue the following certificates to students who submit application and remit the required fee.

- i) Programme Completion Certificate to those students who have completed the programme successfully.
- ii) Transcript
- iii) Backlog Certificate
- iv) Position Certificate to students who are in the first 5 positions in the rank list of each UG programme.

Provisional Certificate: College shall forward the marks and personal details of students who successfully complete the Degree Programme to the University of Calicut. After verifying the details, the University will issue provisional degree Certificates. Students can collect it from the college once it is issued.

Original Degree Certificate: Students have to apply directly to the Calicut University for the Original Degree Certificate. After verifying all the details and getting the degree approved by the Senate, the University will send the Original Degree Certificate directly to the student.

EXAMINATION RULES

(FOR PG STUDENTS)

Attendance: Minimum 75% attendance is required to appear for the end semester examination.

Condonation of shortage of attendance: Condonation of shortage of attendance to a maximum of 10% (9 days) in the case of single condonation and 20% (18 days) in the case of double condonation in a semester can be granted by the Principal. For this, students have to apply in the prescribed format and remit the required fee. Students can avail of condonation of shortage of attendance in a maximum of two semesters during the entire programme (Either two single condonations or one double condonation). If the attendance is below the condonable limit, the student cannot appear for the examination but can move to the next semester. In that case, a provisional registration is needed. Such students can appear for supplementary examination for that semester after the completion of the programme. Women students can avail of maternity leave as per the existing University rules.

Evaluation: Each course is evaluated by 10 point direct grading system. Evaluation has two parts 1) Internal Assessment (20%) and 2) External Assessment (80%).

Internal Assessment: Internal Assessment is done by the course teachers based on predetermined transparent criteria involving test papers, assignments, seminars, attendance etc.

External Assessment: External Assessment is based on end semester examinations conducted by the college. There will be end semester examination at the end of each semester. Notification of this examination will be published one month before the examination in the college website and on the college notice board. Notification contains details of fee remittance, dates for registration, downloading the hall ticket, commencement of examination etc.

Students can register for the examination through the student portal in the college website with the user ID and Password given. Required fee is to be paid online.

Hall Ticket can be downloaded from the date given in the notification upto the date of commencement of the examination. Students should make sure that the name in the Hall ticket is correct. If there is any change students should contact the office of the Controller of Examinations.

Time table will be published at least two weeks before the commencement of examination.

Students should occupy their seats in the examination hall at least 10 minutes before the start of the examination. Students should bring the hall ticket and ID card. Malpractice of any kind is strictly forbidden.

The question paper shall contain short answers, short essays/ problem and long essay type questions with a total weightage of 30.

Answer scripts are subjected to double valuation system. First the course teacher and then an external examiner value the answer scripts. The average of the sum of two weighted grade points (WGP) is taken. If the two WGP sums differ by more than 25% a third valuation will be done by another external examiner. The average of two WGP sums which are closer is taken.

Practical examinations are scheduled by the Departments concerned and conducted by external examiners.

Results will be published within a few weeks after the completion of the examinations. Students can view the results through the student portal using their user ID and Password.

Scrutiny/Photocopy: There is no revaluation since double valuation system is followed. Students can apply for Scrutiny/Photocopy within 10 days from the date of publication of the results. Required fee is to be remitted (All exam related fee are non-refundable)

Pass conditions for courses: For a pass in a course minimum 'P' grade, (minimum GPA 2) when external and internal are combined, is required. Also, a separate minimum of 'P' grade is required for external. There is no

separate minimum for internal. For a pass in the project work, minimum 'P' grade, when external and internal combined is required (There is no separate minimum for external). Students need attain only pass (Grade P) for audit courses.

Total Credits to be acquired: A student needsto acquire a minimum of 88 credits for the completion of the PG programme of which 80 credits are for core & elective courses, and shall only be counted for SGPA and CGPA. Audit courses (AEC & PCC) have 4 credits per course and a total of 8 credits.

NB: For MSW programme, total credits is 100 + 8 credits for Audit Courses.

Semester Grade Card: The college shall issue to the students grade card on the completion of each semester. If the student passes all the courses, SGPA will be given in the grade card.

Improvement: Improvement of a semester can be done only once in the succeeding year after the successful completion of a semester. For the improvement of a semester after the successful completion of the programme (improvement of 3rd and 4th semesters), students have to surrender TC, Final Grade Card and Provisional Certificate. Further they have to submit a declaration that they have not applied for the original degree certificate. Improvement and supplementary examinations cannot be done simultaneously.

Supplementary: The number of supplementary chances is not limited but the student should complete the programme within 4 years from the date of registration.

Grace Grade Points: Grace Grade Points may be awarded to students for achievements in cocurricular activities such as sports, arts, etc. Students with some specified disabilities are also eligible for grace grade points. To add grace grade points, students have to apply to the Controller of Examinations through the teacher-in-charge. After adding grace grade points, the total GPA for a course should be below 4.25.

Final Grade Card: The Final grade card issued by the college after the completion of the programme shall contain the details of all the courses taken during the entire programme and the grades obtained. Final grade

card also includes the cumulative grade point average (CGPA) and the percentage. The list of audit courses passed will also be given in the final grade card.

Programme Completion Certificate/ Transcript/ Backlog Certificate/ Position Certificate: College shall issue the following certificates to students who submit application and remit the required fee.

- i) Programme Completion Certificate to those students who have completed the programme successfully.
- ii) Transcript
- iii) Backlog Certificate
- iv) Position Certificate to students who are in the first 3 positions in the rank list of each PG programme.

Provisional Certificate: College shall forward the grades and personal details of students who successfully complete the PG Programme to the University of Calicut. After verifying the details, the University will issue Provisional Degree Certificates. Students can collect it from the college once it is issued.

Original Degree Certificate: Students have to apply directly to the Calicut University for the Original PG Degree Certificate. After verifying all the details and getting the degree approved by the Senate, the University will send the Original Degree Certificate directly to the student.

VI. IDENTITY CARDS

All students admitted to the college shall compulsorily wear their Identity Cards whenever they are present on the college campus. All payments, issue of certificates, mark lists, entry into the library, laboratory, gymnasium etc., will be made only on producing the Identity Card. Duplicate ID cards can be had from the Librarian on genuine grounds. The Identity Card shall be surrendered to the office at the time of claiming the refund of caution deposit or issuing of Transfer Certificate/Qualifying Certificate, whichever is earlier.

VII. MEETINGS AND CELEBRATIONS

Students should obtain written permission from the Head of the Department for organising meetings, parties or celebrations. The Campus will be open to all the students from 8.00 am to 5.00 pm. Those students who wish to participate in extracurricular activities are permitted to remain on campus till 6.00 pm provided a written request submitted by the students through proper channel (recommended by faculty- in- charge) is sanctioned by the Principal.

VIII. MISCONDUCT AND DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

1. Students are bound to obey the directions issued, from time to time, by the Principal, Teachers and the authorities. Disobedience to such directions would amount to serious misconduct.
2. Any student, who is found to have conducted himself/herself in any indecent or disorderly manner inside or outside the classroom in the college premises is liable to be proceeded against for the said misconduct.
3. A teacher may send a student out of the class if the student misbehaves in the class. If any student is sent out of the class, the teacher and the student shall report the matter to the Principal.
4. The Principal shall have the power to inflict the following punishments upon the offenders: fine, cancellation of attendance, withholding the term certificate, forfeiting education concession and scholarship, suspension, compulsory issue of T.C. without the application from the student or guardian, and expulsion.
5. If any student/students is/are found engaged in defaming the college, staff members or college authorities by posting indecent comments on social media, college management will take stringent actions as per the cyber laws.

IX. MOBILE PHONES

The use of mobile phone is strictly prohibited in the classrooms, corridors and common places in the College as per the Government order. Offenders will be levied with fine and the mobile phone will be confiscated.

X. OUTSIDERS NOT PERMITTED

Outsiders are not permitted to meet any of the staff or students on the college campus without the permission of the Principal. Students shall not bring any outsiders except the parent/guardian to the college premises for any purpose whatsoever without the permission of the Principal.

XI. PARKING OF STUDENTS' VEHICLES

Entry of student vehicles into the campus is strictly prohibited by the Hon'ble High Court. Students can park their vehicles only on the parking area designated. Vehicles parked in the non-parking area will be reported to the police. College is not responsible for any loss/theft/damage of the parked vehicles. No gathering is permitted in the parking area and in the parked vehicles. Parking will be closed as per the Government stipulated college working time.

XII. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES BANNED

Political activities are strictly prohibited on the college campus. As per the order of the Honourable High Court of Kerala on writ appeal No. 535/2003 and judgement on review petition dated 20 February 2004, all strikes, demonstrations, agitations, dharnas, gheraos and the like are banned on the college campus. Students who violate the above rules are liable to be dismissed from the college. Therefore, students shall keep away from all sorts of agitations like strike, disturbing classes, taking out processions, uttering slogans etc. on the college premises. They shall not bring flags, placards, leaflets, pamphlets, notice boards, banners, posters or any publicity material of any political parties or student organisations to the campus.

Court Verdict Banning Political Activities on the college Campus Judgement No. WA-535/2003 dated 26-5-2003 by the Honourable High Court of Kerala "Managements and the Principals of various colleges maintain the stand that they have got a fundamental right to establish and

administer educational institutions under article 19 (1) (a) of the Constitution of India to lay down regulatory measures in the administration of their educational institution and that the students' organisations like SFI, ABVP, KSU etc. have no legal right to interfere with the rights guaranteed to the management under article 19 (1) (a) of the Constitution of India."

"We are of the view that banning political activities within the campus and forbidding the students from organising or attending meetings other than the official ones within the campus is not designed to prohibit any of the fundamental rights of the students guaranteed under article 19 (1) (a) or 19 (1) (c). It is not a total prohibition of any fundamental right, but only reasonable restriction confined to college campus and the code of conduct cannot be flouted in the name of any other freedom or the rights guaranteed under article 19 (1) (a) or 19 (1) (c). Restrictions are only reasonable and designed to promote discipline in the educational institution so that the objectives of the educational institution could be achieved and wisdom of laying down those restrictions cannot be challenged by the student after getting admitted to the educational institution."

"The Kerala University Act, Statutes, Ordinances and other legislations governing the affiliated colleges and the educational agencies or the State Government have not recognised SFI, KSU, ABVP, AISF, NSC, MSF etc. Organisations like SFI, KSU, ABVP, AISF, NSC, MSF etc. are separate legal entities and there is no legal relationship between them and the management of an educational institution or the State Government. They have no fundamental or other statutory rights to carry on their organisational activities within the premises of an educational institution established and administered by various educational agencies in the State as well as the State Government".

"The High Court of Kerala had recorded the affidavit filed by the Principal Secretary to the Educational Department in the Judgement of the Hon'ble Mr. Justice K. S. Radhakrishnan and the Hon'ble Mr. Justice K. Padmanabhan Nair, on Friday the 15th December 2006 - WP (C) No. 22222 of 2006 (U).

“Measures suggested by the State Government are to be welcomed while upholding the right of the managements to stall organisational activities of students’ organisations like SFI, ABVP and KSU etc. directly or through their member students within the campus. Strike, Dharna, Gherao etc. indulged in by students within the campus can also be prevented and State Government and Universities have got a legal obligation to protect the rights of not only the management, Principals and the teaching faculty of the affiliating colleges but also that of Government owned colleges and educational institutions and to take appropriate measures to enforce those rights.”

XIII. RAGGING: A SERIOUS CRIMINAL OFFENCE

Ragging is prohibited by law. It is a non-bailable criminal offence and punishable with rigorous imprisonment up to seven years. Students shall not indulge in any of the following activities, which are treated as ragging:

1. Any act that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of a student.
2. Exploiting the service of a junior student by a senior student or a group of senior students.
3. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a junior student including fund-raising for organisations.
4. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: annoying, playing practical jokes, sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts or gestures.
5. Any act of abuse by spoken words, emails, SMS or any other means.
6. Any word or act that causes hurt to the dignity of the individual.
7. Entering without permission any class other than the one assigned to a student.
8. Forcing a student to boycott class without his/her consent to participate in strike, demonstration, dharna etc.

9. UGC (3rd amendment of UGC regulations, 29th June 2016 as given in 27th June 2019 UGC communication) has defined ragging as any form of physical or mental abuse including bullying and exclusion targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background (3rd amendment of UGC regulations, 29th June 2016; 27th June 2019 UGC communication).
10. Students in distress due to ragging related incidents can call the national anti-ragging **Helpline 1800-180-5522(24x7 Toll Free)** or email the Anti-Ragging Helpline **helpline@antiragging.in**
11. The complaints or information with regard to ragging could be oral or written and even from third parties. The burden/responsibility of proving his/her innocence rests with the accused. Complaints can be lodged with the Principal, Staff Counsellors or any of the members of the Ragging Prevention Committee. All complaints / information received shall be kept strictly confidential. In the event of a student being booked in a criminal offence and being suspended from the college, he / she will be re-instated only after his/her obtaining clearance certificate from the concerned police officer. Contact numbers of ragging Prevention Committee is displayed on the college Notice board.

XIV. COLLEGE HOSTELS - RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The hostels shall be under the direct control of the wardens.
2. The hostellers should abide by the rules and regulations of the hostel.
3. Admission to the college hostel shall be for one academic year and has to be renewed every year.
4. Hostellers should obtain the permission of the hostel warden whenever going out and the details should be entered in the Movement Register at the time of their entry and exit.

5. No hostellers shall enter or leave the premises after 6.00 pm in Ladies Hostel and 6.30 pm in Men's Hostel.
6. The inmates should strictly follow the code of conduct of the college and the hostels, and any breach of the rules will lead to disciplinary actions against the student, and in such cases the decision of the wardens will be final.

XV. COLLEGE LIBRARY - RULES AND REGULATIONS

The college has a well-equipped library with more than 68664 documents. The library is open at 8.00 am. on all working days, including Saturdays.

GENERAL RULES

1. Identity Card issued by the college should be produced at the counter before entering the library.
2. Personal articles such as books, bags, umbrella, files etc. are not allowed in the library.
3. Students are allowed to carry only blank sheets of paper and pen to the library.
4. Library is a place for serious reading and research. Strict silence should be maintained in the library and its premises.

BORROWING AND RETURNING OF BOOKS

1. Students and teachers can borrow books from the library on producing both the Identity Card and the borrower-card. Borrower-cards are not transferable. Reference books are not allowed for borrowing.

2. The borrower should examine the book issued to them and any damage, markings, etc. should be reported to the staff before leaving the counter.
3. The borrower will be held responsible for any defect detected when the book is returned and he/she will have to replace the defective book with a new one or pay such compensation as may be fixed by the Government/University.
4. The loan period is normally 14 days. But the Librarian reserves the right to call back any book, at any time, from any borrower, even if the period of loan has not expired.
5. The loan period may be extended or shortened at the discretion of the Librarian.
6. If the book borrowed from the library is not returned on or before the due date, a fine of Rs. 1/- (One Rupee only) will be charged per day, on each book.
7. If a book borrowed is lost, the matter should be immediately reported to the Librarian.
8. If a book is irrecoverably lost, it must be replaced with a new one or paid for such compensation as may be fixed by the Government/University.
9. If a book belonging to a set or series is lost or damaged and a new volume is not separately available the whole set or series of books should be replaced.
10. In case the borrower-card is lost the matter should immediately be reported to the Librarian in writing.
11. All books and book issuing cards issued from the library to the students, and the members of the staff should be returned on or before the last working day of the academic year or on the date fixed by the Librarian.

12. Students should obtain "no dues" remark from the Librarian while applying for Transfer Certificate.

XVI. PLAGIARISM CHECK

The main objective is to create awareness about the responsible conduct of research, promotion of academic integrity and prevention of misconduct including plagiarism in academic writing among students, faculty and research scholars. It shall be mandatory to screen all the final year UG and PG dissertations and PhD theses. The supervisor shall go through the report generated by antiplagiarism software before certifying the same. Students/research scholars in their dissertation/thesis certificate shall certify/declare that the thesis is plagiarism-free as per the norms of the Institute.

XVII. RESEARCH ETHICS

Research ethics involves the application of fundamental ethical principles to research activities which include the design and implementation of research, respect towards society and others, the use of resources and research outputs, conduct of scientific principles and regulations of research.

XVIII. OTHER RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Smoking and consumption of alcoholic beverages are strictly prohibited on the college campus. Students shall not use or bring tobacco or its products, intoxicating drinks or narcotic substances to the college. Possession and use of tobacco/ narcotic substances on campus is considered as a punishable offence.
2. Students shall not go on tour, picnic or excursion without the written permission of the Principal.
3. Prior written permission of the Principal is necessary for organising processions, meetings, entertainment programmes, functions in the college; for collecting funds from the students/staff; and for distributing notice or putting up any notice on the noticeboard.

4. Students shall not cause any loss or damage to the college property. Intentional causing of loss or damage will be considered a serious misconduct. The offenders will be proceeded against for the same and will be liable for recovery of the loss. Unintentional causing of loss or damage will result in the recovery of loss or damages from the offenders.
5. Students shall not desecrate the statues of Jesus Christ and St Joseph and/or write or make any marks on the walls or any part of the college property. If found guilty they are liable to be punished and the expenses for the repair work will be recovered from the offenders.
6. Cinematic dances and fashion shows are not permitted on the college campus.
7. Congregating at the entrance of the college gate and sitting on the portico and the steps of the staircase are to be avoided.
8. Students are free to follow and practise any religion of their choice but external worship other than catholic is not allowed in the college.
9. A student who has any complaint against any other student, teaching staff or non-teaching staff shall represent the same either in writing or orally to the Tutor, HoD, Discipline Committee, Internal Complaints Committee, Students' Grievance Redressal Cell or to the Principal directly. Such representations can be made by the Parents/Guardian of the students also. A complaint box is installed near the college office in this regard.

B. STUDENT SUPPORT PROGRAMMES / SCHEMES

ADDITIONAL SKILL ACQUISITION PROGRAMME (ASAP)

The Additional Skill Acquisition Programme (ASAP) is an initiative of KSHEC with the objective of tackling the issue of growing unemployment in the state. The Programme aims at equipping selected school/college students with skills in Communication, IT and selected areas of industry and service sectors.

BLOOD DONORS CLUB

The Blood Donors Club promotes voluntary blood donation to serve the needy and ensures safe and sufficient blood supply. The Club focuses on recruitment and retention of blood donors, and also on the conduct of programmes on the importance of blood donation to increase public awareness.

BHOOMITHRA SENA CLUB

The Club is an initiative to encourage students to adopt ecofriendly practices with a view to creating an awareness in society about environmental degradation and climate change. It also serves as a platform to organize seminars, workshops, debates etc which make students conscious of the necessity of preserving Nature and environment for posterity.

CAREER GUIDANCE & PLACEMENT CELL

The Cell offers guidance and assistance to students as regards higher studies and placement opportunities. Experts from various walks of life serve as resource persons at the seminars and workshops organized by the Cell to impart soft skills and leadership qualities to the students.

CERTIFICATE/ VALUE-ADDED COURSES

Students can build their skills through a Certificate/Value-Added course. The courses help to strengthen their competency and enhance commitment to the profession. This platform builds expertise in the subject

area and assists in their progressive academic evolution. These courses act as a bridge which effectively fills the knowledge gap, ably assisting students in their pursuit of international courses in future.

DEVAGIRI CIVIL SERVICE ACADEMY

The college offers Civil Service examination coaching to UG students. Online classes are arranged in collaboration with Civil Service Institute, Pala. The coaching will help students to appear for any UPSC examination.

EBSB – EK BHARAT SHRESHTHA BHARAT

The initiative EK Bharat Shreshtha Bharat was announced by the Honourable Prime Minister on 31 October 2015 on the occasion of the 140th birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel. Through this innovative measure the knowledge of the culture, traditions and practices of different States and UTs will lead to an enhanced understanding and bonding between the States, thereby strengthening the unity and integrity of India.

ENTREPRENEURIAL DEVELOPMENT CLUB (ED CLUB)

The ED club aims to inculcate values like integrity, discipline, honesty etc. and to sensitise students on the economic and industrial development scenario. It helps in inculcating entrepreneurial culture, providing opportunities for successful entrepreneurs and students to work together and create academic and industrial research linkage.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL (EOC)

The EOC will ensure opportunities for inclusive, equal and quality higher education to the SEDG (Socio- Economically Disadvantaged Groups) category. The EOC shall function as a statutory umbrella body over the existing cells, such as the SC/ST Cell, OBC Cell, or any other Cell, without any hindrance or interference to the functioning and mandated activities of the latter. The cell shall protect the constitutionally guaranteed

rights, dignity, safety and security of all individuals belonging to the SEDGs and also ensure them equal access and opportunities to pursue higher education with the help of the existing statutory bodies such as SC/ST Cell and OBC Cell.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL FOR MINORITY STUDENTS

The minority cell of the college is formed with the purpose of empowering the minority communities in the college. The Minority Cell basically helps minority students including Buddhists, Christians, Jains, Muslims, Sikhs etc. for their academic development. The aim of the Minority Cell is to empower the minority communities in the College and assist them in their curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL FOR OBC STUDENTS

The OBC Welfare section ensures the welfare of the students who belong to Other Backward Classes. Students are informed about the various schemes meant for their benefit and are guided to avail of them as and when needed.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL FOR PHYSICALLY CHALLENGED

The Differently-Abled Cell established in the College aims at facilitating equal opportunities, ensuring protection of their rights and creating congenial environment for their full participation. The cell works to realize the constitutional dream of equal citizenship for all differently abled persons. The cell formulates and monitors special policies, guidelines, and schemes to ensure enjoyment of equal opportunities for the differently abled persons in all the walks of campus life. The cell endeavours to sensitize the college community to respect and cooperate with the differently abled persons.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL FOR SC/ST STUDENTS

The SC/ST cell of the college is established with the purpose of empowering the SC/ST students in the college. The college takes special interest in facilitating financial support to students from these communities from government agencies and other sources. It ensures equal opportunity and social justice to the Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes students by providing them equal opportunities in the fields of education. It extends support in the form of learning opportunities by organizing extra coaching, remedial classes so as to bring them on par with good performers.

FINE ARTS COMMITTEE

Fine arts committee envisages an overall development of the potential of students in the field of art and literature. The committee provides ample support to the students for participating in fine arts competitions.

GOLDEN JUBILEE INSURANCE SCHEME

In memory of the College Golden Jubilee Celebrations an insurance scheme known as “Devagiri College Golden Jubilee Insurance Scheme” was instituted by the College PTA. A student is eligible for the benefits of this scheme from the moment he/ she gets enrolled as a student of this college. If a student dies (by accident/disease) while he/she is a student, his/her family will get an insurance amount of Rs.30,000. If a student meets with any accident and gets injured while he/she is on campus or while he/she is part of any programme related to the college, he/ she is eligible for medical assistance subject to a maximum of Rs. 2,000.

GREEN CLUB

The Green Club in our college is a vibrant assembly of eco-conscious students working towards a greener campus. Committed to environmental stewardship, the club orchestrates tree-planting campaigns, waste reduction initiatives, and educational seminars on sustainable living. It's a dynamic space where ideas blossom into action, promoting a culture of

environmental mindfulness among students. Through collaborative efforts, the Green Club not only enhances the campus's greenery but also nurtures a sense of responsibility for the planet among the college community.

GUIDANCE CELL FOR SECURING FOREIGN PhD REGISTRATION

The Guidance Cell informs the interested students about the availability of PhD positions in foreign universities and makes them aware of the formalities and procedures for getting admission for a PhD programme.

ICCR STUDENT SUPPORT

Students from different countries apply for various undergraduate and postgraduate programmes offered by the college through the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR). The scheme ensures the well being of the foreign students enrolled in various courses catering to their diverse needs.

INSTITUTION INNOVATION COUNCIL (IIC)

The main focus is to systematically foster the culture of innovation in the institution. The IIC encourages, inspires and nurtures young students by supporting them to work with new ideas and transform them into prototypes, and also promotes innovation and entrepreneurship in the institution through various modes.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

The Cell addresses the complaints on the part of the students in relation to the internal assessment carried out in the college, and seeks to redress them in a time bound manner. Students are given a time frame to register their complaints immediately after the publication of internal examination results.

INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE

The committee aims at prevention, prohibition and redressal of sexual harassment of women employees and students in Higher Educational Institutions. It deals with cases of sexual harassment of the students or employees in the college and provides mechanism of dispute redressal. It advocates the empowerment of women and has zero tolerance for any kind of sexual harassment. ICC diligently works towards providing a secure environment to students, teaching and non-teaching staff.

IPR CELL

The IPR Cell of the College aims to create awareness on IPR among the faculty and students of the college and other stakeholders of the institution. IPR plays a significant role in providing access to educational resources and open education. It helps in the promotion of innovative techniques and widespread dissemination of knowledge.

MEDICAL FACILITY

The service of a medical officer is available on campus every Friday. Group Insurance facility is available for the entire staff and students of the college.

MENTOR-MENTEE SYSTEM

Mentor-mentee system at St. Joseph's College, Devagiri is a mechanism constituted with a view to providing a close accompaniment to the students by the teachers.. A set of students will be allocated to a designated mentor who in turn will provide guidance and counselling at every stage of their student life. The mentor will keep track of the students' performance in academic and other co-curricular activities.

MS OFFICE AND TALLY COURSE

Fr. Bennet Kurian Memorial Computer Centre attached to the Department of Commerce offers MS Office and Tally Course for the students of the College as well as for the public.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

Two wings of the National Cadet Corps (NCC) function in the college: the Army Wing and the Navy Wing. The NCC provides opportunities for military training and social services. Membership in the NCC is voluntary. Students are enrolled after a selection procedure. Every enrolled cadet has to continue in the corps for a minimum period of two years. At the end of the period a weightage certificate will be given. Cadets can also appear for the 'B' and 'C' certificate examination. The cadets obtaining the certificate are eligible for grace marks in final examinations. They are also awarded 5 bonus marks for PG programmes at the time of admission.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

Two units (Nos 16 & 100) of the National Service Scheme function in the college. The NSS aims at education through social service. Membership in the NSS is voluntary. Under the auspices of NSS a unit of the Institute of Palliative Medicine functions in this college. Volunteers who undergo the prescribed course of training are given certificates from the University and are eligible for grace marks in University examinations. They are also awarded 5 bonus marks for PG programmes at the time of admission.

ORATORY CLUB

The club conducts elocution and declamation competitions every year to enhance the oratorical skills of the students. The programmes make students socio-politically conscious enabling them to become socially responsible and committed citizens.

PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION (PTA)

Membership of the PTA is compulsory for the parents of all the students of the college. The PTA Executive regularly meets for the planning and implementation of all matters pertaining to the physical, intellectual and moral welfare of the students.

POSTDOCTORAL GUIDANCE CELL

The main objective of the Postdoctoral Guidance Cell is to encourage scholars with PhD who wish to pursue a career in research to apply for various Postdoctoral research opportunities both in India and abroad. Aspirants will be informed about the available fellowships and grants, and will be guided to apply for the same.

PRIME MINISTER'S SPECIAL SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME FOR J&K STUDENTS

It is an initiative by the Central Government funding the educational expenses of the students from these states. The College extends institutional support to these students and takes care of their educational requirements while they are the guests of the state.

PROF. TERRENCE JACOB MEMORIAL AUDIO-VISUAL THEATRE

The audio-visual theatre attached to the Dept. of English, was instituted in 2006 in memory of late Prof. Terrence Jacob, an illustrious Teacher of English, who worked in the Department of English from 1969 and retired as the Head of the Department in 2002.

QUIZ CLUB

The Quiz club aims to promote the general knowledge of the students and encourage them to be up to date with current affairs. The club is a platform for the students to better their quizzing skills.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND PRIZES

ENGLISH

1. Rev. Fr. Theodosius Memorial Scholarship, instituted by the management, staff and the public in honour of late Fr. Theodosius, the first Principal of the College, is awarded to the degree student who secures the highest score in Part I English (I & II years).
2. Rev. Fr. Shabor Memorial Prize, instituted by the Management in honour of the first Manager of the College, is awarded to the student who secures

the highest grade in MA English previous (Semester I and II together) Examination.

3. Prof. Sheppard Memorial Prize, instituted by the management, staff, students and the public, in honour of the late Prof. Sheppard, is awarded to the student who secures the highest score in MA (English) final examination.
4. Rev. Fr. Reynolds Jubilee Memorial Prize, instituted by the management, is awarded to the student who secures the highest score in part I English Main, during the First and Second years.
5. Prof. P. K. G. Vijayaram Endowment, instituted in 1993 by his colleagues and PG students in honour of Prof. P.K.G. Vijayaram, Head of the Dept. of English from 1974 to 1993, is awarded to (i) the Final Year MA English student securing the highest score; (ii) the First Year MA English student securing the highest score; (iii) the Third Year BA English student securing the highest score.

SUPPORT PROGRAMMES

SCHOLAR SUPPORT PROGRAMME

The programme is designed to give special attention to students who need extra help and guidance to keep abreast with other classmates. Teachers, on a structured basis, handle special evening classes.

SOCIAL SERVICE PROGRAMME CELL

In this programme, a student has to complete 12 days of social service. This has to be completed in the first four semesters; 3 days in each semester. For the regular programme the student has to work in a Panchayath or Local body or in a hospital/ poor home or old age home or in a Pain & Palliative centre or do any social work assigned by the College authorities. Students who engage in College Union activities and participate in sports and cultural activities in Zonal level have to undergo only 6 days of SSP during the entire programme. The whole documents regarding the student should be kept in the college and the Principal should give a Certificate for the same. The list of students (who successfully completed the programme) must be sent to the Controller of Examinations before the commencement of the fifth semester examinations. A College level Coordinator and a Department level Coordinator shall be appointed for the smooth conduct of the programme.

STUDENTS GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

The Cell enables a student to express feelings by initiating and pursuing the grievance procedure in accordance with the rules and regulations of the College. 'Students Grievance Cell' enquires and analyses the nature and pattern of the grievances in a strictly confidential manner. Usually the Cell deals with the issues related to academic and administrative problems.

STUDENTS GUIDANCE AND COUNSELLING CENTRE

The Guidance and Counselling Centre aims at enabling students to maximize their overall growth and to overcome their academic and personal problems. The service of qualified persons is available in assisting students to identify, recognize and solve their academic and personal issues.

STUDENTS WELFARE COMMITTEE

The major source of the fund is the monthly collection from teachers and well-wishers and it is used to extend help to those needy students in basic learning requirements.

TOURISM CLUB

The club aims to create awareness about the relevance of tourism and sensitize the students to responsible Tourism and Ecotourism. It also aims to familiarize them with the rich heritage of our country with the specific intention of promoting national integration.

TUTORIAL SYSTEM

This system has been specifically intended to bring up the abilities of the student through proper motivation and guidance. It is also meant to understand the student, his/her family conditions, socio-cultural status, the problems that he/she faces in and outside the class etc. and help him/her to tide over those problems. For this, a teacher is given the charge of a class and he/she acts as the class tutor. The class tutor keeps the details of the students from entry level to exit level. The tutor guides, helps, motivates the student and acts as a liaison between the parents and students. Class tutors convene class-wise parent teacher meeting once or twice a year. The system also ensures effective teaching and sufficient attention to the student and fosters the general discipline of the college. The student is expected to consult the tutor on all academic/ non-academic matters. All applications and requests to the Principal shall be submitted only through the tutor countersigned by the HoD.

UGC/CSIR - NET COACHING

The Career Guidance Centre of the College offers coaching to postgraduate students preparing for UGC-NET examinations for General Paper. For subjects, the respective departments offer coaching. Admission is open to all eligible candidates.

UNNAT BHARAT ABHIYAN (UBA)

The Unnat Bharat Abhiyan Programme is to equip and familiarize the students with the socio-economic dimensions of the rural communities, the

status of sustainable use of natural resources, changing perceptions, aspirations and priorities, and the innovative effort of the rural communities for sustainable development. It enables the community to roll out strategies, methodologies and processes to develop sustainably and create cohesive communities where every individual gets equal opportunity to realize his/her potential.

VALUE EDUCATION

The realization of the need ‘to shift from the information-based education system to a value-based education system imparting life skills which can contribute to man-making and nation-building’, is the foundation of the value education. The College offers value education classes to all first year degree students. Each department is entrusted with the duty of engaging value education classes for their students.

WALK WITH A SCHOLAR (WWS)

Walk with a Scholar (WWS) is an initiative of KSHEC to arrange specialized mentoring programmes for students in Undergraduate programmes in Arts, Science and Commerce. The Scheme aims at giving necessary orientation to needy students to prepare them for employment and at giving them necessary guidance, motivation and mental support to identify appropriate areas for higher studies as well as employment.

WOMEN'S WELFARE CELL

The cell is constituted as per the directive of the UGC to redress the grievances, if any, of the women students and the women-members of the staff of the College. The Cell also aims at motivating the girl students to strive for gender equality in diverse fields, with a motto of grooming them to lead a dignified life in society.

YOUNG INNOVATORS PROGRAMME (YIP)

Young Innovators Programme is launched to promote a culture of innovation among the students in the College at a very early stage of their academic journey. This helps to identify and motivate students towards creative aptitude and research acumen.
